



High School Students Devote Hours to Dorothy Day's Cause

s student transcribers in the diocesan inquiry of Servant of God Dorothy Day, two seniors at St. Jean Baptiste High School in Manhattan have made history.

Christine Llano and Kayla Irizarry were each named typist/copyist of the diocesan inquiry of New York's Ms. Day, as was Aulina Presendieu, sophomore religion instructor and director of library and media resources at St. Jean Baptiste.

Father Richard Welch, C.Ss.R., judicial vicar of the archdiocese's Metropolitan Tribunal who is also Cardinal Dolan's episcopal delegate, signed the decrees (as did a notary) that named the three typists/copyists, and administered oaths of the same, which included a confidentiality component, May 3 at St. Jean Baptiste.

"It was obvious talking to them that they are on fire with the example of Dorothy Day and what they've learned," Father Welch said of Christine and Kayla. "They're transcribing Dorothy Day's own handwritten diaries and letters" and other materials, he said.

"And they are a part of history. What they're transcribing is very important," Father Welch said, "because it becomes what we call the acts of the cause."

Christine, a 2015 alumna of Sacred Heart School, the Bronx, said she is proud to have been chosen for the endeavor. "Knowing the (canonization) process and how difficult it is, to be a part of it is very surreal. To see a glimpse of everything was very, very interesting. As I learned more about her, I just felt very privileged to be able to do something like this."

Kayla, who graduated from St. Luke's School, the Bronx, in 2015, said she is "very grateful to be a part of this project. It was very exciting. I feel like I learned a lot about her, and the canonization process. I feel very accomplished in a way because...I have done my part."

When the work in New York is complete, it will be transmitted directly to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints at the Vatican in Rome. "That becomes part of the permanent record that will then establish the cause moving forward," declaring Ms. Day venerable, followed by her beatification and sainthood, Father Welch said.

"Like I was kidding with the young girls, this takes many years, but they're young enough that they'll probably be around for the canonization."

He also told them that they should CONTINUED ON PAGE 36



t St. Theresa Church in the Bronx, Cardinal Dolan told eighth grade students, "Class of 2019, congratulations—you've done a great job." The graduation Mass was for 660 students graduating from 19 Catholic elementary schools in the Northeast/East Bronx region.

"It's especially appropriate that as you approach your graduation from grade school you would say, "Well, one great thing I learned in my Catholic school was to thank God—to thank God every day for all His graces and mercy—and for all the blessings that He's given me," the cardinal said in his homily at the Mass offered on Ascension Thursday, May 30.

"So how appropriate it is that you come to gather now for the greatest act of thanksgiving we have, the holy sacrifice of the Mass, to thank Him for the gift of your Catholic education. We're very proud of you."

Speaking about the hard work it takes to keep Catholic schools strong and successful, Cardinal Dolan told the students, "You make it all worthwhile. And for you— the Class of 2019—and with you, we thank Almighty God." He expressed gratitude for the hard work and support of administrators and teachers in the schools, of parents and grandparents, and of pastors and staff of the region's parishes.

"They sacrificed to get you to this spot," said the cardinal, who noted he often meets people who gratefully tell him they attended a Catholic school in the Bronx or elsewhere in the archdiocese.

"And now you all are part of that legacy. So congratulations," he said, his words greeted with applause.

Cardinal Dolan told the students that it was Ascen-








Billionaire Helped Toussaint Scholars Before Morehouse Gift

illionaire Robert F. Smith capped off the May 19 commencement ceremony at Atlanta's Morehouse College with a surprise announcement—he pledged to pay off the graduates' student loans.

Smith, who is the founder, chairman and CEO of the private equity firm Vista Equity Partners, said he and his family would set up a fund that would clear the student loan debts of the class of nearly 400.

Smith was the 2015 recipient of the Pierre Toussaint medallion in the archdiocese, which was presented by Cardinal Dolan in Harlem that November in recognition of his global philanthropic work. During that time, Smith made an individual donation of \$100,000 to the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Program.

Administered by the archdiocesan Office of Black Ministry, the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund provides scholarships to graduating high school seniors of diverse backgrounds from public, private and parochial schools throughout the archdiocese to assist them with the educational fees and expenses associated with their college studies. Additionally, the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Program provides mentorship and support to student leaders who attend colleges and universities throughout the country. Pierre Toussaint scholars major in various fields of study, including engineering, education, international relations, nursing, economics, premed, pre-law, film and marketing.





Another eighth-grader at the Mass was Angela Acosta, 14, from St. Theresa School. Angela said it was clear from the homily that the cardinal "appreciates everything" the schools, parishes and families of the students have done to help the young scholars reach this educational milestone.

"He helped us understand what everybody is doing for us, and how we're going to make an impression in the world because of where we went to school, and how we should be proud of that," Angela said. She participated in St. Theresa's theater program, and in September she will attend Talent Unlimited High School, a performing arts school in Manhattan, where she will focus on dance.

Josephine Fanelli, principal of St. Theresa School, said the cardinal's message "was enlightening... hopefully the students will go out into the world and be witnesses of our faith for all to see...I've told the eighth grade that it's like going on a vacation now. We've packed their bags—we've given them everything that they need to go out into the world and succeed, and to be witnesses of Christ."

Cardinal Dolan, toward the end of liturgy, thanked

the students and others at the Mass, including the 14 concelebrating priests, most from the region's parishes. Also attending were Michael Deegan, interim superintendent of schools in the archdiocese, and Linda Dougherty, regional schools superintendent for the Northeast/East Bronx.

Msgr. Thomas Derivan, pastor of St. Theresa parish, in closing remarks, told Cardinal Dolan, "Your Eminence, I know they all want to thank you."

"You're welcome," the cardinal quickly said.

"So, we're going to do it together," the pastor continued, leading all into a loud round of applause.

Father John Figueroa, who was ordained by Cardinal Dolan the weekend before, gave the closing blessing.



To St. Brigid School, With Thanks

ttorneys who appear before me often say with surprise that when they approach the bench, they can read my trial notes upside down. In law school when we worked in study groups, my handwritten outlines stood out for their clear, concise print. "Guess I didn't go to Catholic

school" is the rueful refrain I often hear when an attorney's scrawl is indecipherable.

Penmanship was prized when I attended St. Brigid School on the Lower East Side, where the Sisters of Charity taught us. After lunch and robust play in the schoolyard, we practiced the art of beautiful writing while listening to classical music. The small hands that grasped pencils to trace the alphabet eventually held ballpoints, quill pens and fountain pens to practice cursive writing and calligraphy. Our educational foundation was outstanding. I still use fountain pens—and diagram sentences in my head—when I write.

Art was also an important part of our curriculum. When we visited the Met and other museums with Mom, my younger sister Betty and I marveled at how large the masterpieces were in comparison to the replicas we pasted into notebooks at school. The simple essays we wrote next to each picture card helped us understand color, perspective, symmetry, symbolism and context. When Betty became a public school principal in the South Bronx, she made sure that an arts curriculum was available for her students, too.

Our school reflected the diversity so typical of the Lower East Side: We were Italian, Irish, Puerto Rican, African-American, Polish, German, Portuguese and more. One of my classmates was Buddhist, traveling from Chinatown each day. Mom walked us to and from Lillian Wald Houses, the public housing project on Avenue D where we lived. Our little sister Josie eventually joined us in her stroller and became an artist when she grew up. Back then, the

atya Hybran, a freshman at Cathedral High School in Manhattan, has been accepted into the Academies at Harvard. The Academies are intensive, five-day academic enrichment programs for high-achieving high school students, offering lessons in coding, business, politics and pre-med.

Katya will attend the Summer Politics Academy in July. The SP Academy will cover topics such as American news media, free speech, constitutional law and American education policy. The goal is for students to learn how political science addresses important issues of our time, and how public officials implement policy in response.

Cynthia Garcia, Katya's guidance counselor, said Katya is an honor roll student who hopes to attend Yale University and become a lawyer. "When I came across the program, I thought it would be a great opportunity for Katya, and I nominated her for it," Ms. Garcia said.

Lower East Side was anachronistic: Avenue C was a marvelous hodgepodge of family-owned small shops and outdoor stands. There were even two horses that pulled wagons full of fruits and vegetables. The bustling bakery at the corner of Seventh Street and Avenue C sold Italian bread, onion bread, bialys, éclairs, rugelach and hamentashen. Yiddish, English and Spanish were freely spoken and, in the spring, merchants sold fragrant lilac branches. Our classrooms smelled very good, indeed.

Throughout the years, I've thought often about the small oasis where we learned about social justice, Martin Luther King and our responsibility to help others. Some of us lived in the projects and others in

walk-up tenements. We knew about drugs and crime and many of us were poor. Some of our parents were illiterate; our dad only finished third grade. At school, we were taught that just like the art masterpieces we studied, we were each unique and beautiful.

I recently read with heart-wrenching sadness that St. Brigid School will be closing its doors in June. I don't know where you are, or whether you're even alive, but to all the teachers and staff and my classmates, I want to simply say "Thanks."

Mount St. Michael Pitcher To Play in Elite League

ount St. Michael Academy's Alex Santos is one of 80 high school juniors in the Class of 2020 Major League Baseball draft eligible players invited to participate in the inaugural Prospect Development Pipeline League at the IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla.

The 17 year old is one of two players from New York state and the only one from New York City participating at the invitation-only camp running from June 13 to July 4 and sponsored by Major League Baseball and USA Baseball.

"Being able to show my talents with other players with the same amount of talent and play in front of the (professional and college) coaches, it's going to be a great experience and I can't wait to get there," Santos told CNY.

The 6-foot-3, 185-pound right-handed pitcher, who has verbally committed to attend the University of Maryland, has a 94-mph fastball and changes speeds to keep hitters off-balance.

"Kids like Alex don't come around very often," said Mount St. Michael coach Walter Stampfel. "When he came into our school, we knew he had

tons of potential and we moved him up to varsity right away. The second half of this season, he really started to blossom, and he has gotten a lot tougher on the mound."

Four teams of 20 players will be selected for games, with former MLB greats Chipper Jones, Ryan Howard, Barry Larkin and Derek Jeter serving as coaches. Teams will have the opportunity to play at Tropicana Field, home of the Tampa Bay Rays.

The top PDP League players will be given the chance to compete in the High School Home Run Derby and the inaugural high school showcase game in Cleveland during Major League Baseball's All-Star Week.

Forty PDP League players will be invited to the 2019 18U National Team Trials in Los Angeles in August. A 20-man roster will be chosen for the World Baseball Softball Confederation U-18 Baseball World Cup in Busan, South Korea, Aug. 30-Sept. 8.

Two Presidents, Principal Appointed at High Schools

wo presidents are right at home and a principal is making history as three appointments were recently announced at Catholic high schools in the archdiocese.

Lou Tobacco is the president and CEO of Msgr. Farrell High School, effective June 17, and Kathryn Jaenicke was named president of Notre Dame Academy, effective July 1. Both are graduates of the schools they now lead on Staten Island.

Susan Natale will be principal of All Hallows High School in the Bronx for the 2019-2020 school year, becoming the first woman principal at the 110-year-old boys' high school.

Tobacco, who was student council president as a senior at Msgr. Farrell, is a graduate of the University at Albany and served three terms as a New York State Assemblyman, representing the 62nd district on Staten Island.

His appointment completes the school's new leadership team. In January, Larry Musanti, a longtime

teacher and assistant principal at the school, was named principal. They succeed Msgr. Edmund Whalen, who served as principal since 2010 before becoming vicar for clergy in the archdiocese in January.

"I look forward to all of us—administration, faculty, staff, coaches, students, parents and alumni—working together as one team to bring Farrell, in an exciting way, to new heights," said Tobacco in a statement.

Ms. Jaenicke, who began her teaching career at Notre Dame Academy in 1991 and has served as principal of the school since 2011, will succeed Sister Patricia Corley, C.N.D., who served as president of Notre Dame Academy for 11 years.

Ms. Jaenicke, who has chaired the Staten Island Catholic High School Principals Council, received a bachelor's degree in English education from the University at Albany, a master's in literacy from St. John's University, Queens, and a master's in administration and supervision from Fordham University, the Bronx.

Ms. Natale, the dean of academics at Iona Preparatory School in New Rochelle since 2006, will succeed Sean Sullivan, who has served the school for 50 years and will be principal emeritus.

Ms. Natale, who taught for 10 years at The Ursuline School in New Rochelle, earned a bachelor's degree in math from Manhattan College and a master's in teaching and educational leadership from Iona College. She has supervised the faculty and overseen the curriculum evaluation and enhancements as academic dean of Iona Prep.

All Hallows and Iona Prep were both founded by the Congregation of Christian Brothers.

"In a changing educational landscape, my philosophy is to make certain that students and their teachers have all the tools needed to continue to produce graduates who, in the Christian Brothers tradition, are critical thinkers and ethical leaders," said Ms. Natale in a statement.

Alumnus Elected President Of Franciscan University

Franciscan Father David Pivonka, the newly elected president of Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio, has assumed his leadership duties immediately, and his formal inauguration will take place later this year.

The friar, who graduated from the university in 1989, is a nationally known preacher and evangelist who for seven years has been director of Franciscan Pathways, an evangelistic outreach of his Franciscan community. He has senior-level administrative experience from holding various posts at the university, 1996-2008.

Ordained a priest in 1996, he is a solemnly professed member of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Province of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis of Penance, which founded and operates the university.

"It's both humbling and an honor to be chosen to lead Franciscan University of Steubenville," Father Pivonka said in a statement. "Over 30 years ago, I first arrived at Franciscan as an undergrad and received an outstanding education as well as life-changing spiritual formation as part of a dynamic, Catholic intellectual and faith community.

"A lot has changed in our culture in the last 30 years, but Franciscan University continues its mission to provide a superior education in a vibrant faith community where students and parents alike can be confident in their choice of Franciscan University," he said.

In a unanimous decision May 21, the university's board of trustees elected Father Pivonka to succeed Franciscan Father Sean O. Sheridan, who served as president since 2013. He resigned in April but stayed on as president until his successor was named. A native of Durango, Colo., Father Pivonka received a bachelor's degree in theology from Franciscan University and went on to earn a master of divinity degree and a master of arts degree in theology from Washington Theological Union in 1996. He wrote his master of arts thesis on the indissolubility of Christian marriage.

He earned a doctorate in education from the Graduate Theological Foundation in 2005, with a doctoral project focused on Catholic education in a post-modern world. He also earned an executive juris doctorate from Concord University School of Law of Purdue University Global in 2011.
