

me to be a better person, to always be kinder to other people, and to love each other as you love yourselves."

The Inner-City Scholarship Fund (ICSF), founded in 1971 by Terence Cardinal Cooke and a group of prominent executives of different religious backgrounds, annually awards \$12 million to more than 11,000 Catholic school children in 56 Catholic schools located in lower Westchester County, the Bronx, Manhattan and Staten Island.

Average family income for scholarship recipients is about \$24,000 and approximately 71 percent of scholarship recipients live near or below the federal poverty level.

In the archdiocese, 99 percent of Catholic high school seniors graduate and 99 percent of the graduates are accepted into colleges.

Aguinas had its final classes June 2, will hold its final graduation ceremony June 10 and students will take final exams in the days following graduation.

Students have been learning in hybrid and remote fashion due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Luz Perez-Arias, a senior heading to Fordham University in the Bronx, said her confidence level grew by taking on leadership roles with the school's student council and varsity volleyball team.

"As an incoming freshman, you're always thinking of your senior year," said Luz, who is studying remotely. "I wasn't able to experience my last year of high school with my peers. I wish things were different.

"I'm very grateful I will be able to graduate from Aquinas High School."

The Dominican Sisters of Sparkill purchased an entire block of property in the Belmont section of the Bronx known as Grote Estate from the Astoria Homestead Company. The property, featuring a Victorian mansion and three-story frame house, was located from East 182nd to East 183rd streets

#### Campus Ministry at Bronx High School Helps Form Faithful Leaders

he campus ministry program at Saint Barnabas High School in the Bronx is committed to providing Christian leadership and guiding students in their faith journey through outreach projects and "assuming a more vital role in the schoolwide ministry."

Last month, five of the school's students received the sacrament of confirmation, including one who also received the sacrament of first Holy Communion. Ms. Traditi said she and other school staff members congratulate the five students "who have dedicated and prepared themselves to receive the sacraments."

Principal Theresa Napoli said, "It gives me great pride to know that our Catholic faith lives within the halls of Saint Barnabas High School and, by example, these young women have chosen to strengthen their faith."

The five students were sophomore Michelle Torres, freshman Ceili Chapter, freshman Ciara Leo, sophomore Arriana Rijfkogel and freshman Shania Cueto. Shania also received the sacrament of first Holy Communion.

"I am asked to further my faith through my actions," Shania told CNY, citing lessons from her sacramental preparation. "The words at Mass said by the priest are, 'Do this in memory of me,' just as Jesus said them. It is a way that we feed our souls. It is also a time when we come together to receive the sacrament as a Catholic community."

Shania noted that she is looking forward to participating in more charitable projects during the next school year as a sophomore than she





hen he first began as chief operating officer of the nonprofit Care for the Homeless in 2016, Ronald Lawson thought that if he worked hard every day, he "would be helping our organization go out of business."

It hasn't exactly turned out that way, as his organization's operations have expanded consid-

erably since then. Its budget of \$35 million is almost double what it was when he started.

Care for the Homeless runs 26 health care centers in New York City, as well as two shelters for women—a 200-bed facility in the Bronx and one in Manhattan with 120 beds. Some 8,000 to 10,000 individuals who are homeless or

unstably housed use its services annually.

Lawson is overseeing the construction of three new shelters and six new health centers.

To better understand the scope of the challenge, New York City's homeless population, if ranked as a city, would stand just behind Utica as the llth largest in New York state.

Despite the daunting task ahead, Lawson, 68, says he plans to dedicate the rest of his working life to the cause. He said he's not sure that homelessness in New York City will disappear in his lifetime, but he's confident that he and his co-workers at Care for the Homeless "are a team of concerned, committed folks trying to address this problem."

The biggest way they do that is by delivering quality health care. Foot problems are a consistent bane to their clients, so podiatry services are offered. Dental services are also offered at two of the health centers run by Care for the Homeless.

The organization's philosophy, espoused by CEO George Nashak, is that those they serve receive health care equal or superior to the rest of New York City's residents.

The reason is simple. Once the homeless receive such care and are stabilized, "it's easier to get them placed" into permanent housing, Lawson said.

Care for the Homeless has placed 1,200 women who were homeless into permanent housing over the past 11 or 12 years, he said.

Lawson was one of seven people honored last month by his alma mater, the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass., with the Sanctae Crucis Award for their extraordinary service and leadership in critical fields during the Covid-19 pandemic. It is the highest non-degree accolade the Jesuit college bestows on alumni.

"I was quite surprised and humbled," Lawson said. "A lot of very highly regarded alumni received it."

He and his wife, Nina Klyvert-Lawson, are active parishioners of St. Charles Borromeo in Harlem, where he is a parish trustee and chair of the finance committee. They have an adult daughter, Bailey.

Before he switched to the nonprofit world, Lawson spent the early part of his career employed at wellknown Wall Street firms.

After a layoff in the early 1990s, he fully expected to be back to work in short order. When that was not the case, he was unprepared to weather the personal downturn. He hadn't saved while times were good. He assumed that his work experience and degrees from Holy Cross and

Carnegie Mellon University would help him land on his feet.

As weeks turned into months, he was forced




to put almost everything he owned into storage and move into a roachinfested apartment with the friend of a friend.

"I know what it's like to lose everything you own," he said.

He was fortunate to have good friends who helped him eventually get back on his feet. A pastor of a Presbyterian church in Brooklyn, where he was living at the time, also gave him a piece of sage

advice that Lawson took to heart: "Hard times don't last always."



and from Belmont to Cambreleng avenues.

The property served as a school for younger children in St. Martin of Tours parish starting in 1900. When the parish school opened in a new location, the Dominican Sisters of Sparkill opened Aquinas Hall, a two-year business school, to 30 young women in September 1923.

In 1939, the historic mansion was demolished and Aquinas High School was constructed, welcoming 438 students when it opened in September 1939. In the next decade, enrollment increased to 800 students.

Aquinas received state and national honors over the years, becoming the first high school in New York City to be named an exemplary school by the U.S. Department of Education in 1985. First Lady Laura Bush visited Aquinas on Sept. 11, 2002, the first anniversary of 9/11.

"It was a home away from home," said Sister Catherine Rose Quigley O.P., a 1959 Aquinas graduate who served as school principal, 2000-2018, and assistant principal, 1994-2000.

"It provided an education for women appropriate to a particular time. It was a quality education in the Catholic tradition."

The Dominican Sisters of Sparkill will continue leasing the property to the Cardinal McCloskey Charter School and Cardinal McCloskey Community Services.

A celebration to mark the 100th anniversary of the opening of Aquinas is planned for 2023.

"There always was so much life in the building," said Kris Sherwood, a teacher at the school since 1993 who will teach at St. Joseph Hill Academy on Staten Island for the next school year.

"The building is stunningly beautiful, always so clean and bright. There was something about this building. You walked up to it and you were hooked to it."

Leslie Limardo graduated from Aquinas in 1993 and has been library media supervisor at the school since 2018. She said the school always prepared its students for college and life, and shared what she'll miss most when the school closes.

"I think it's the hours of conversations with the students," she said. "As a librarian you help students with research and anything they need.

The girls would come to the library to just talk. They would surround my desk and talk. It was something I would look forward to and missed during the pandemic."

Mark Shultz became the school's first lay principal in the 2018-2019 school year, when there were 248 students enrolled in grades nine through 12.

"In my 40-plus years as an educator, I have

never been in a more loving, demanding and supportive environment," Shultz said. "I will miss every student, faculty, staff member, parent and alumni who participated at one time or another in our mission to 'educate and inspire young women for a lifetime of faith, learning and compassionate action toward a more just world."

Students and staff will leave with memories with students looking to follow in the footsteps of graduates such as actress Debbi Morgan and Julissa Reynoso Pantaleón, current chief of staff to First Lady Jill Biden and former U.S. ambassador to Uruguay.

Reynoso Pantaleón, a 1993 graduate, will deliver a virtual commencement address at graduation June 10. Thirty-seven seniors will graduate and nine juniors are graduating after taking classes last summer to meet graduation requirements a year early.

"We need to celebrate these young women," said Dr. Mary Anne Evangelist, board of directors chair and a 1964 Aquinas graduate.
"They've been through more challenging times than any of us with the pandemic."



we've been doing it for 50 years. The organization is still thriving 50 years later," said Susan George, executive director of the Inner-City Scholarship Fund since 2004.

Ms. George attended the Mass as did Inner-City Scholarship Fund Board of Trustees President Peter T. Grauer, chairman of Bloomberg, L.P.; Michael Deegan, superintendent of archdiocesan schools; and contributors and benefactors to the scholarship fund efforts.

Cardinal Dolan, in his homily, thanked everyone for their work and financial support as he reflected on the day's reading from Sirach and Gospel from Mark, and said how fitting they were for this Mass.

"The first reading, extolling the gift of generosity that when we return to God what He's given us, it is extraordinarily pleasing to the Lord," he said. "So take those consoling words from God's holy word in the Bible this evening as an affirmation for your tremendous loyalty and generosity to this cause of our inner-city Catholic school scholarship fund.

"And, in our Gospel, Jesus is again talking about the value of sacrifice. When we sacrifice, when we give of ourselves, how pleasing that is to God and so many of your offerings have been at the point of sacrifice and difficulty and hardship. I've seen you dig deep. I've seen you come through time and time again even after a significant donation. When Susan (George) sounds the alarm bell, you come through again

to the point of sacrifice."

Cardinal Dolan closed his homily with a conversation he and Pope Francis had in the car after the pontiff's 2015 visit to Our Lady Queen of Angels School in Harlem. The pope asked Cardinal Dolan to explain who the benefactors were that he met at the school and what they did.

Pope Francis was surprised the government did not pay and was amazed how these kids were able to attend Catholic schools.

"I said we have to raise the money so that these kids can get this extraordinarily effective education of mind, soul, heart and body, and he was amazed, as I am to be honest with you and as the community in the world is amazed, that your consistent generosity has made this noble experiment possible for half a century," Cardinal Dolan said.

"Thank God. Thank you."

Isabella Lopez is an eighth-grader at Christ the King, who will attend Preston High School in the Bronx in the fall. Isabella, who recited the petitions at the Mass, receives scholarship funding along with her sister, Adrienne Lopez, a sixth-grader at Christ the King.

Isabella and Adrienne were in the cathedral for the first time.

"It's a very impressive cathedral," Isabella said. Their mother, Taisha Rodriguez, was also visiting the cathedral for the first time and was thankful her daughters are attending Catholic school.

"We came into Catholic schools later on in their education, and it's changed their outlooks, their responsibility and their attitudes on school and learning," she said. "They enjoy going to Catholic school. They love their friends. They love their teachers. They are having a really good time and a really great experience."
